The Pastoral Nominating Committee of the Oregon Trail Presbyterian Ministry has been working with Melanie Hancock, Interim General Presbyter of the Presbytery of Northern Kansas since the fall of 2016 to find a pastor to shepherd our churches. The PNC is very happy to announce that an offer has been made to Shannon Borgman of Spokane, Washington. #### Shannon Borgman's Bio



Shannon was born in Township, Michigan, The only daughter of four children. She has two older brothers and one younger. At six years old her family moved to Tehachapi ,California for work and to be closer to family. Her father was a rocket scientist at Edwards Air Force base and her mother recently retired as the Director of WIC for all of Kern County.

She grew up with an eclectic church experience, ranging from Christian Reform, the Nazarene Church, the Quaker Church and the Presbyterian Church. Her parents are strong Christians, but the two older brothers do not believe, adding a touch of agnosticism and atheism. It was a dynamic childhood filled with lively debate, faith, questions and exploration.

When they moved to Tehachapi, her parents joined the local Nazarene Church. Holiness defined by right living was the call for all Christians. Altar calls, testimonies, the sinner's prayer and right living defined the boundaries for living out faith. Her questions never found a home in the local youth group, so her parents formed a small, teen Bible study. Here questions were accepted, discussion was encouraged, and community came first. Upon graduation from high school, she attended Whitworth University. Still looking for her faith she found herself drawn to the reformed theology. Holiness began to give way to grace and God began to untangle her heart. Shannon met Adam at Whitworth during her sophomore year. Their friendship really took root a year later when Shannon asked him to sign up for ballroom dance classes. She needed six guys to join the class in order to get in and Adam was one of the six.

In 2000 she graduated with a BA in Communications and a certification in Children's Ministry. After graduation she spent two years in AmeriCorps working with children from varied community settings. She married her college sweetheart on August 26<sup>th</sup>, 2006 and moved back to Spokane, Washington. The week before the wedding she interviewed for the Children's Ministry position at as a Youth and Family Director for the same church.

Shannon has been blessed to serve in ministry for the last twelve years. She earned a MA in Theology from Whitworth and in 2017 she graduated with a Master of Divinity from George Fox Seminary. God has a funny sense of humor. For a long time, Adam said that he would not be a pastor or marry a pastor, and on more than one occasion Shannon has said that she would never be a preacher. But as the years have gone on, God has slowly unraveled the "nevers," to reveal a deeply pastoral call. For more than a decade God has used and transformed her into the pastor she is today.

The past eight years Shannon has had the privilege to serve the congregation of the Opportunity Presbyterian Church in Spokane, Washington. Here she fell in love with the church and with the PCUSA. And as God has moved her and called her into new areas of ministry the church has made room for her to grow into a pastoral role. During the last two years she has also taken on the role of chaplain at Park Place Senior Living Facility. Here she serves all three levels of care: independent, assisted and memory. She is excited to bring all that she has learned and all that she still has to learn to the pulpit as an ordained minister to the four congregations of the Oregon Trail Presbyterian Ministry.
